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MAKEUP for a Graduation: Stay as natural as possible on foundation. It is not always picture friendly. Black eyeliner and mascara give the drama. The rule of thumb for liner is from the corner of the eye to the end of the brow, moving up at the outside of the eye. Concentrate on the eyes and go a little stronger so you don't fade in pictures. If you are wearing all black, incorporate color on the eye. Contrast your color selections against your outfit. Because it's daytime, go with very light makeup. Pinks and bronzes are good colors. Nails should be a French manicure. With lips, it really depends on the eyes. If you are going light on your eyes, then go heavier on your lips, such as plums or reds.

MAKEUP for a Quinceanera: Smoky eyes are always good for a Quinceanera. Try using dark and bronze shades. Color for eyes is in, too, so try teals, purples and greens. You can play up the eyes but go softer on lips. If professional photographs are to be taken during the event, use more dramatic makeup, but remember to enhance your natural features. Not all foundation is picture friendly - keep it light. Nail colors should be reds and purples.
